Leonard Hame Williams









Record of Commemoration Rifleman 392478 of Queen Victoria's Rifles

This plaque was restored in 2016 by stonemason Graham Bessey of Critoph & Crowe.

William Carver Spurgeon was born on 10th Feb 1842 and married Elizabeth on 31st Jan 1861. He was a fisherman and also a member of The Old Company of Beachmen. He was awarded a silver medal, now in the keeping of his great granddaughter, for the rescue of seven men from the Brig Osip on 13th Jan 1866.

He lived at Russel Villa, 2 Newcombe Road, Lowestoft. He had two children, Margaret, who was a Sunday school teacher at Christ Church, and Albert who was a very well known & respected Cox of Lowestoft Lifeboat for many years.
